He was popularly known among the members of the exclusive Denver and Denver Athletic Clubs where he gave many years of service as a waiter. He assisted Mr. Alfred Lamborn, manager, in the opening of the Stanley Hotels, Estes Park, Colo., and remained for several years as steward and headwaiter until Mr. Lamborn resigned. "Baldy Dick" as he was generally called by his associates and friends (sic) was generous to a fault, always contributing to the welfare of others. He was particularly careful as to his mother's welfare up to her death which took place only three weeks ago. He is survived by a sister and brother-in-law Mr. and Mrs. Chas.
