

## Marietta Basilia Sandoval Solis

Marietta Basilia Sandoval was b. in 1860 in Taos, New Mexico to parents: Maria Armijo b. 1831 and Vicente Sandoval b. about 1824. Marietta Sandoval married Daniel Solis December 1879 in New Mexico. (Per granddaughter Beverly Solis Gonzales, who works in the Denver, Colorado area).

Per census records we learn that Marietta and Daniel had 9 children, all of which were born in New Mexico. Marietta was a housewife, while her husband was a day laborer, working mostly for the railroad.

In the 1900 census we see Marietta, 37 yrs old, (listed as Basilia b. Apr 1863) and family residing in Wagon Mound, Mora County, New Mexico.

In the 1910 census we see Marietta, 45 yrs old, and family residing in Ponil, Colfax County, New Mexico.

By 12 or 13 January 1920 (date census was taken), we see Marietta (listed as Mary), 56 yrs old, and family residing in Cheyenne, Laramie County, Wyoming.

By 3 April 1930 we see Marietta (listed as Mary), 56 yrs old (sic), and family living in Brighton, Adams County, Colorado.

Two of Marietta's children (dau: Trinidad and son: Avelino) would pre-decease their father Daniel, who died 9 January 1952 at the age of 98 in Cheyenne, Laramie County, Wyoming. Daniel was b. 8 April 1854 in New Mexico.

Marietta Basilia Sandoval Solis, a resident of Brighton, Adams County, Colorado, d. August 1933 at the age of 78 years. She was interred 18 August 1933 at Denver's Riverside Pioneer Cemetery.
